



God Led Him Here A Staff Person's Call: Mike Smith, Dir. of Support Services

Rev. Tom Laymon: How did you come to know Christ?

Mike Smith: I had been attending a small church in my hometown and listening to the preacher. He was a fire brimstone kind who wasn't messing around and I could understand what eternity was. I got the concept at a pretty young age, and I did not want to spend eternity in hell. I could understand that Jesus died for me on the Cross. I went forward at vacation Bible school so I couldn't have been more than 12.

I heard the Word a lot I never really read it for myself and that is probably what was my downfall. In my teenage years and young adult early twenties I kind of strayed. I went off the rails and fell in with my friends who were not believers. During that time some of my buddies wanted me to do something or continue going out and getting into trouble or whatever. I could really sense the Lord telling me not to. Some pretty bad things happened to a couple of my buddies. One of my good friends was killed in a car wreck which they had wanted me to go with them on that night. I really felt the sense of Lord telling me no, you just need to go home! Many things like that happened in my past and I didn't know then, but I know it now. It was God and the Holy Spirit protecting me through some of that stuff.

Not until a little bit later into my 20s I had a job where I had to travel a lot by myself and just being out there alone and feeling lonely was hard to handle. I also had a co-worker who said as he opened his drawer pulled out his Bible, this all you need to read!

But the first time I read it I said when I get to Jesus anywhere, I'll just say God. That's how far away from Christianity I gotten. I'll just say God because I wasn't so sure I got through the first gospel. I was on my knees asking for forgiveness for even having that kind of attitude. I had an apartment close to our church that I really started being involved in. That's when my walk with Christ really got deeper. This was a major turning point in my life.

Rev. Laymon: What's your occupation? What were you doing for a while?

Mike Smith: I was a repairman for a local car factory. At that time, I worked for a robot company, and I moved here from the Detroit area. We had other people stationed at other plants. And so, I moved here to oversee a project of retooling the Chrysler plant.

So, after a year of traveling. I said I can't do that anymore. I happened to be at the local plant and there was a guy working on this big giant copier. I said what do you have to do to work on this Xerox? He told me to call this guy right here and they hired me on the spot.

Rev. Laymon: So you worked on Xerox machines for 15 years? So after those 15 years? I think you showed up at the Mission.

Mike Smith: I did. Yes, I've been praying during that time. I felt like God was shaking me up a little bit to do something different. Yeah. And my dad was an alcoholic. I struggled with alcohol. I felt like I had to do something. I wanted to do something. Trying to help people who were struggling. Somehow, I didn't have the credential, to do that.

Then you ran an ad in the newspaper. It was a huge ad too. The whole top part of it talked about Faith-Based Organization was looking for a mature Christian man. And then the bottom half was to do the Support Services job.

Rev. Laymon: I always ask, why do you want to work for the Mission? That's one of my standard questions. God was working in your heart, so you wanted to do something to help those who struggle with addictions.

Mike Smith: Right. Yep. And it just so happened I had the skills to do the the other part of the job too. So yeah, to me, it seems like a perfect fit.



Rev. Laymon: So you've been here at the Mission for a good long while?

Mike Smith: 2004. 20 years.

Rev. Laymon: What are some of the highlights for you of being here at the Mission?

Mike Smith: Well, developing relationships with the men. Even though they come and go, some of them have passed away. I enjoy developing relationships with them, and seeing them succeed.

Rev. Laymon: One of the things that I would say that's kind of a gift and talent that God has given you. You have the talent to try to visualize what a Gospel presentation would look like and how that might be made, for Thanksgiving or Back to School.

Mike Smith: I would say He has given me the talent or the ability to create something.

Rev. Laymon: You've had a key part in creating an opportunity to winning people to Christ. How's that make you feel that you have had that kind of role of winning people. Over thousands!

Mike Smith: I thought of it, more of just that's part of my job here that God has put me here to do this. So, I'm going to do it.

Rev. Laymon: You have been able to use some other talents as well, using computer programs to organize us.

Mike Smith: The access programs that I used to make the databases started when I worked at Xerox.

Rev. Laymon: It sounds like God led you here.

Mike Smith: I do really believe that and yeah, it's weird. I had one idea to work for Xerox. I had no idea what SBM was. Absolutely no idea. I have a degree in electronics. That transferred me here. Whether I knew it or not, you know, God was preparing me. And then was at Xerox. He used all my history. Yes, he grabbed me by the collar and dragged me here.

Rev. Laymon: Yeah, and he's kept you here and besides, I mean you, you also got a degree from Rescue College. (A college dedicated to serving the Rescue Mission Organizations now called City Vision University).

Mike Smith: Yes.

Mike Smith: As far as God working in my in my life. Patience, I've learned here. Patience. I've learned patience. Lots of patience. Lots of patience.

Lamont is more than just an Urban Vintage worker. While he carries out his duties, he also has the opportunity to work alongside men and women who are currently in the New Life Program. Through his personal experience and persistence, he was able to complete the program. Now he can encourage others to do the same.

Now that Lamont is working, he has the ability to own and maintain his own car. He was only able to acquire a vehicle because of a generous donor who gave a car to the Mission. Prior to having his own transportation he had to depend on bus schedules and friends to shuttle him places.

Now he can come and go as needed. A particular blessing he experiences is being able to visit his mother. Her health is failing, and his car can accommodate her wheelchair. Now they go places together. Lamont's family is also out of state. This car allows him to visit family more frequently.



Additional benefits Lamont can enjoy are the ability to attend church and various church functions. Lamont also enjoys the accomplishment of ownership and a little boost in self-esteem.




women and children that come to us. **YOU make a gigantic dif- ference** for now and eternity.
